Phishing Red Flags

Scams using payment apps such as Cash App, PayPal, Venmo, and Zelle are growing more and more prevalent as those platforms become increasingly popular. Once you're hooked, it only takes seconds for a scammer to access your hard-earned cash.

Be Wary of Texts or Calls about Payment Apps

Payment app scams often start with a phone call or text. If you get an unexpected call, just hang up. If you get an unexpected text, delete it. Even when they seem legitimate, you should always verify by calling your bank or payment app's customer service number.

Use Payment Apps to Pay Friends and Family ONLY

Don't send money to someone you don't know or have never met in person. These payment apps are just like handing cash to someone.

Raise the Alarm on Urgent Payment Requests

Scammers rely on creating a sense of urgency to get you to act without thinking. They might claim your account is in danger of being closed or threaten you with legal action. These high-pressure tactics are red flags of a scam.

Avoid Unusual Payment Methods

The bank will never ask you to pay bills using a payment app, or ask you to send money to yourself. Scammers can "spoof" email addresses and phone numbers on caller ID to look like they're from the bank, even when they're not. When in doubt, reach out to the bank directly by calling the number on the back of your card.

I was Hooked! What Do I Do?

Notify the payment app platform and ask them if they can reverse the charge(s). Give us a call at the bank.

RASDak: Ride Across South Dakota

RASDak is an annual bicycle ride to enjoy the beautiful scenery and hospitality of South Dakota. On Thursday, June 6th, RASDak riders began arriving in Arlington mid-morning thanks to a strong northwesterly wind that assisted them on their 66 mile trek from Clark. The riders had begun their 416 mile week of riding in Garretson on June 1st and rode as far north as Sisseton before returning south. After leaving Arlington, the riders rode to Sinai where they briefly stopped for refreshments before continuing with the final leg of their trip back to Garretson. Many local church/school/youth organizations provided rest stops and meals along the route and at overnight locations. In Arlington, the local FFA chapter assisted riders and members of the Fire Department assisted the riders in Sinai.

Amongst this year's riders were Mark Stearns and his son Nathan. Mark is a Director of the Citizens State Bank and is an avid long-distance bike rider.

The RASDak Fund was set up by the South Dakota Community Foundation to help assist in funding a scholarship for each overnight town visited by that year's RASDak riders. Creamy Grape Salad

2lbs Seedless Red Grapes	1 C Sugar
3 TBS Brown Sugar	2 TSP Vanilla
2lbs Seedless Green Grapes	3 TBS Chopped Pecans
1oz Softened Cream Cheese	1/4 TSP Baking Soda

- 1 C Sour Cream
 - 1. In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese, sour cream, sugar, and vanilla until smooth and blended.
 - 2. Fold in grapes to the mixture and transfer to a serving bowl.
 - 3. Cover and refrigerate until time to serve.
 - 4. Before serving, sprinkle the top of the salad with the pecans and brown sugar.
